FISHERIES RESEARCH TECHNICIAN

The Algonquins of Ontario (AOO), in partnership with Harkness Laboratory of Fisheries Research, are seeking to hire an individual to participate in the organization and implementation of aerial surveys to assess winter angling activity in Algonquin Provincial Park. The successful candidate will be hired by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry to participate as a crew member for each survey flight, recording data and field notes. This individual will also be responsible for data entry and quality control, and coordinating communications with AOO community members who wish to volunteer for flights. The successful candidate will be required to work at least one day each weekend for the duration of the contract.

Contract Duration: December 12, 2016 – March 31, 2017 (The start date may be later depending on ice conditions but will start no later than January 3, 2017)

WHAT CAN I EXPECT TO DO IN THIS ROLE?

YOU WILL:

- Participate in winter flights over Algonquin Provincial Park throughout January, February and March 2017 to record angler activity
- Assist in contacting and scheduling Algonquin Community members that wish to volunteer and participate in the survey flights
- Record data and notes during flights
- Enter and verify survey data
- Participate in additional activities related to fisheries surveys such as preparing age and growth materials, preparing stable isotope samples, data entry

QUALIFICATIONS & REQUIREMENTS

1. Valid class “G” driver’s license or equivalent as recognized by the Province of Ontario
2. You possess substantial knowledge of the landscape of Algonquin Park and the surrounding area
3. You are able to comfortably fly in a small airplane (Turbo Beaver) for several hours at a time while visually surveying the ground below
4. You have proficiency using a computer for data entry (some familiarity with Excel or MS Access is an asset)
5. You possess good communication and organizational skills
6. Flexibility in scheduling as flights will be weather dependent
7. Willingness and ability to work outside of regular office hours (early mornings and weekends)
