Aboriginal Peoples of Canada Adaptations Regulations (Firearms) Application

BEFORE YOU START...

THIS FORM IS FOR USE BY Aboriginal individuals (Indian, Inuit, Métis) who wish to benefit from one or more of the provisions of the Aboriginal Peoples of Canada Adaptations Regulations (Firearms) when applying for a Firearms Licence. You must also submit a licence application. Use either form "Application for a Licence under the Firearms Act (for Individuals Aged 18 and over)" (CAFC 921) or "Application for a Licence Under the Firearms Act (For Minors)" (CAFC 671).

COMPLETE THIS FORM IF:

- You are an Elder and wish to be alternatively certified for firearm safety training.
- You are an adult and wish to be alternatively certified for firearm safety training and the Canadian Firearms Safety Course is not available within reasonable time. location or cost
- You are a minor less than 18 years old and wish to be alternatively certified for firearm safety training.
- You are a minor less than 12 years old and wish to engage in the traditional hunting practices of your community.
- You wish to have your Elder or Leader's recommendation considered by the Chief Firearms Officer (CFO) of your province or territory in the event that the CFO considers refusing your application or adding conditions to your
- You do not speak, write or read English or French.

IF YOU ARE A MINOR LESS THAN TWELVE (12) YEARS OF AGE, you must have the consent of a parent or legal guardian to be eligible for a firearms licence. Your parent or guardian can provide their consent by signing and dating Section E.

IF YOU NEED ADDITIONAL SPACE, list all information requested on a separate sheet of paper, add your name to the top of each sheet and attach the sheet to your application.

A - PERSONAL INFORMATION

The applicant must provide their name and address information in Boxes 1 to 3.

B - ABORIGINAL COMMUNITY INFORMATION

You must provide the name and address of your Aboriginal community.

C - REASONS FOR APPLICATION

Put an "X" beside the reason(s) for applying under the Aboriginal Peoples of Canada Adaptations Regulations (Firearms). You may select more than one.

D - ELDER OR LEADER'S INFORMATION

Boxes 7 - 8

Under certain cases you must provide the name, address and contact information of an elder or leader of your community. See Section F and G of this information sheet for further details.

E - APPLICANT DECLARATION

If you are a minor, you must have the consent of a parent or guardian to be eligible for a firearms licence. Your parent or guardian can provide their consent by signing and dating Section E.



F - ELDER OR LEADER'S RECOMMENDATION

Adults Applying for Alternative Certification for Firearms Safety

If you are an adult (over 18 years of age) applying for a firearms licence and wish to be alternatively certified for firearm safety because the Canadian Firearms Safety Course is not available to you within reasonable time, location or cost, an elder or leader of your Aboriginal community must complete **Sections D**, **F and G** of this application form.

Minors Applying for Alternative Certification for Firearms Safety

If you are a minor applying for a minors firearms licence and wish to be alternatively certified for firearm safety, an elder or leader of your Aboriginal community must complete **Sections D and G** of this application form.

Alternatively, an adult other than an elder or leader of your community who has known you for at least the six (6) month period preceding your licence application, can also provide a recommendation. See Section H - Recommendation of an Adult for Alternative Certification of a Minor of this information sheet.

Minors Less than Twelve (12) years of Age Engaged in Traditional Hunting Practices

If you are a minor less than twelve (12) years of age and wish to engage in the traditional hunting practices of your community, an elder or leader of your Aboriginal community must complete **Section D**, **F and G** of this application form.

Adults applying to have their Elder or Leader's recommendation considered by the Chief Firearms Officer

If you are applying for a firearms licence and wish to have an elder or leader's recommendation considered by the Chief Firearms Officer of your province or territory, an elder or leader of your Aboriginal community must complete **Sections D, F and G** of this form. Your elder or leader must describe why it is important that you participate in the traditional hunting practices of your Aboriginal community.

G - ELDER'S / LEADER'S DECLARATION

If you have checked off **Boxes 6 b), c) d) or e) in Section C** of this form the elder or leader or your community who is recommending you must sign and date the application. The only exception to this is if you are minor applying for alternative certification for safety training and an adult who has known you for at least six (6) months is recommending you. In this case the elder or leader does not sign the declaration in Section G.

H - RECOMMENDATION OF AN ADULT FOR ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION OF A MINOR

An adult who has known you for at least the six (6) month period preceding your licence application, and who has been certified by a Chief Firearms Officer or has already passed the Canadian Firearms Safety Course can provide a recommendation that you have requisite knowledge to be alternatively certified in firearms safety. They must complete Section H and I of this application form. If you require more space, attach a separate sheet of paper, add your name to the top of the sheet and attach it to the application form.
